Dear Year 6 Parents,

I hope you are all well and are getting used to what seems to be our “new normal”. It has been wonderful to see so many of the Y6 children return to school and to still have the great communication online with those who have not.

At this point of the year, our main focus is preparing the children for the next stage of their academic journey: secondary school. Whilst we have been able to provide many transition activities to help prepare them, there are also areas that we have been unable to include within our curriculum. One of these areas is Personal Social Health Education (PSHE) and Sex and Relationships Education (SRE).

For the Sex Education aspect of our SRE lessons, we aim to provide a safe and nurturing environment for the children within which they feel comfortable to share their questions and queries, as well as to learn what is always deemed as ‘slightly awkward’ content. Unfortunately, due to the current organisation in school, we are unable to proceed with our programme for Sex Education this year. This is because not all children are with their own class teacher, some Year 6 children are in critical worker bubbles and, most significantly, we are unable to teach this content to boys and girls separately as we cannot mix the bubbles.

We therefore are writing today to share with you the learning objectives that your child would have been taught in these lessons:

To know that male and female sexual organs are used to make a baby
To know how babies grow inside a mothers’ womb
To know how babies are born
