

- 2. Brackets () dashes or commas , for parenthesis

- 4. Colon : to introduce a list and semi-colon ; within lists
- 5. Bullet points to list information
- 6. Hyphens to avoid ambiguity [e.g. man eating shark/man-eating shark]
- 7. Passive voice
- 8. Cohesive devices across paragraphs by repetition of a word/use of adverbials [e.g. on the other hand, in contrast, as a consequence] and ellipsis
