A Child's War Topic tasks: Choose one of these tasks to complete:

Ready, Steady Rationing

During the war, rationing was introduced to ensure the country did not go into famine. Conduct further research into rationing during WWII and create your own recipe book of baked/cooked goods that were popular at the time. Choose one food item from your recipe book to cook and bring in to school for us to try!

Evacuation Presentation

Life for children evacuated during the war was very different to what they were used to at home in the city. In class, we have researched evacuee life and explored the thoughts and feelings experienced by the evacuee children. Imagine you are to be evacuated right now in 2016 and have to leave your home. Use ICT to create a comic strip/story board to tell the story. Please ensure you check the program used is compatible with a PC.

War Weaponry

Many new weapons were introduced in WWII that were not around during WWI (V1 Doodlebug for example). Conduct research into this weaponry, then design and build your own miniature model of the weapon.

We Need YOU!

The government produced posters to persuade people to join the war effort. Conduct research into this and produce your own poster using mixed media. You might choose to use collage materials, paint, ICT... mix it up!
