

# Barrow Hedges Autumn 1 Nursery

## Themed Learning Journey

### Context for Learning



Finally, we had lots of fun throwing the leaves in the air and catching them. Our Nursery Garden is a special place to be to enjoy the season!



Now we start Nursery Home Learning finding objects for Pirate Pete Treasure Box. We learn to name and match colours.

The children look carefully at the leaves to notice the different colours. We learn the colour names. Purple, yellow, orange, red and brown. We explore colour mixing and paint our own autumn leaves and pictures using different media and techniques.

We have fun singing lots of autumn songs and rhymes. Joining in the actions.

The children are shown how to develop their fine and gross motor control with activities such as painting with conkers by rolling them in a tray, pegging up leaves and raking leaves in the Nursery garden.

The children learn to name the items they have found. They find 1 conker, 1 leaf, 1 pinecone. We go on to learn all about the number 1!

The children sort the autumn treasure into 'big' and 'small'.



The Children go on an autumn walk. They notice how the leaves are changing and that there are lots of leaves and autumn treasure on the ground. How did they get there?



This theme helps the children to learn about the changes to the seasons, to talk about colours that we see and to learn new vocabulary.

The Children learn to make tiger stripes, mark making in lots of different ways using big arm movements.

This theme helps the children to have fun with role-play, to use their imagination, to make links from stories to their own experiences and promote the love of reading.

The children have lots of fun when there is a knock at the Nursery door. Who could it be? Oh No Not the Tiger. The children have great fun acting out the story.

### Autumn Colours and Autumn Treasure


The children help to make a role-play café and Sophie's house in Nursery and enjoy dressing up as Sophie and Tigers to act out the story!

The Children taste different types of tea. From real teapots. How grown-up. Raspberry is the favourite!



The children teach Little Tiger to use an indoor voice. No big roaring Little Tiger!

The children teach Little monkey to look after our toys and to tidy up!



### The Tiger Who Came to Tea.

The Children have lots of fun listening to the story of the Tiger Who Comes to Tea.



The children teach Zazu the Parrot to be kind hands and to take turns and share- No snatching Zazu!

The children listen carefully to the story of The Little Tiger Goes to School. They hear about some of the things they will do at Nursery and how important it is to learn the Nursery rules to be safe and happy at Nursery.

### Little Tiger Goes to School.



The children teach Little Leopard to use walking legs indoors to keep safe. We meet Tarzan the Tortoise who shows us how to walk slowly.

The children teach the elephant to Listen with his big ears. They know that good listening means using your listening ears, looking eyes and good sitting.

This theme helps the children to adhere to the Nursery Rules and to settle happily into the Nursery setting.
