

Barrow Hedges Autumn 1 Reception Themed Learning Journey

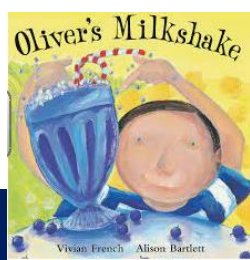


Context for Learning

Finally we play matching games as we learn where eggs and meat comes from.

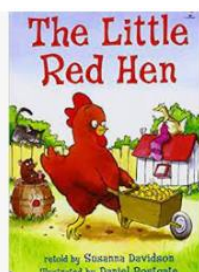


We always talk about which foods are healthy for us and why.



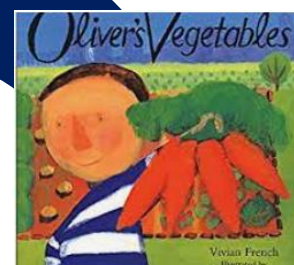
Oliver helps us to know Where milk comes from!

The Little Red Hen helps us to learn where wheat and bread comes from.



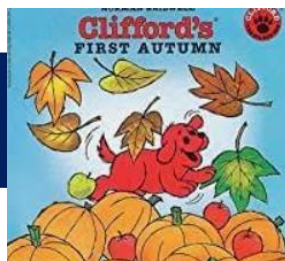
Clifford goes to the Grocery Shop and finds lots of autumn Vegetables ready for the Harvest. Does this food come from the Grocery Shop?

Apples grow on the tree, Blackberries on a bush, Pumpkins on the ground and carrots in the ground. We sing songs, listen to stories, grow our own carrots and plant seeds.



The children learn where some of the autumn vegetables come from and have lots of fun exploring.

The Children learn about the seasons and how they change. They match weather and clothes to the seasons. They listen to 'Clifford the Big Red Dog Explores Autumn'.



This theme helps the children to learn about the changes to the seasons, to know about Harvest and to understand that some foods are grown on, under and over the ground. They also learn about foods that are good for us.



The Children learn lots of new vocabulary and listen to many pirate stories.

This theme helps the children to have fun with role-play, to use their imagination and to sequence the events in stories.

The children learn the words to the song/story and use them in their play.

The Children learn to sequence the story and re-tell the story in order.

The children teach Howling Haddock to use an indoor voice.

By listening carefully to the story of 'Don't Eat the Teacher' the children learn about the characters and all the mischievous things they get up to!

The children join in with the song; which tells the story of 'We are Going on a Pirate Hunt!'

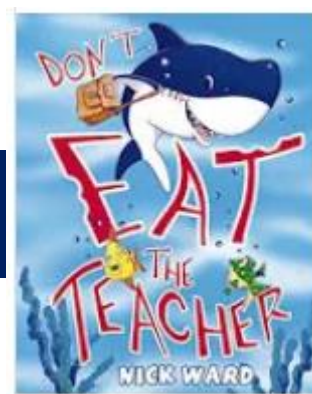


The children teach Sharon Shrimp to use walking legs indoors to keep safe.
