Christians call **Jesus** the **Light of the World**.

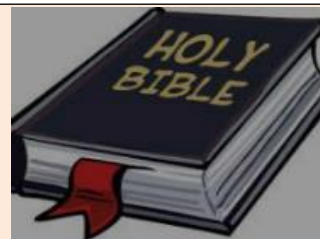
**Advent** is a special time of preparation for Christmas.

What is the special book for **Christians**?

The **Bible**.



How is the Bible organised?

The Bible is a collection of 66 books.

It is made up of the **Old Testament** and **New Testament**.

Who wrote the Bible?

The Bible was written over a period of 1500 years by many different people.

How is the Bible used in daily life?

Christians might read the Bible to feel closer to God, to give them guidance, to learn more about their faith or to bring them comfort.

What do we learn from Jesus' stories?

Jesus told **parables** to get his message across to his listeners and so people could remember and understand what he had taught them. Christians believe it is important to follow Jesus' example and teaching.



What are some customs of Lent?

It is traditionally a time for giving something up and praying. This is to remember Jesus' **sacrifice** when he went into the desert to pray and fast for 40 days before later dying on the cross.

What are the key events of the Easter story?

**Palm Sunday** – Jesus entered Jerusalem.

**Maundy Thursday** – Jesus had a Last Supper with his disciples.

**Good Friday** – Jesus died on the cross.

**Holy Saturday** – Jesus lay in the tomb.

**Easter Sunday** – Jesus rose from the dead.
