
Our Values:

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Welcome to the Foundation Stage where we Learn, Play and Grow.

The EYFS (**E**arly **Y**ears **F**oundation **S**tage) is aptly named; it provides the foundation to prepare the children for school, Year 1 and beyond.





Everything the children learn in the EYFS at Barrow Hedges provides a foundation for future learning. For example, in Reception children learn to read and write a range of sentences, building on from earlier mark making opportunities experienced in Nursery, enabling pupils to successfully access the English curriculum in Year 1.

There is a common misconception that children 'just play' in the early years, this couldn't be further from the truth. Adults provide a rich learning environment and skilfully intervene in play, helping children to make links in their learning, and to build on from what they already know. "Children develop quickly in the early years and a child's experiences between birth and age five have a major impact on their future life chances. It promotes teaching and learning to ensure children's 'school readiness' and gives children the broad range of knowledge and skills that provide the right foundation for good future progress through school and life."

Early Years Foundation Stage Statutory Framework

Adults work to develop the 'Characteristics of effective learning.'

"The **Characteristics of Effective Learning** describe behaviours children use in order to learn. To learn well, children must approach opportunities with curiosity, energy and enthusiasm. Effective learning must be meaningful to a child, so that they are able to use what they have learned and apply it in new situations. These abilities and attitudes of strong learners will support them to learn well and make good progress in all the Areas of Learning and Development."

Child Initiated Learning

In Nursery and Reception, we use the children's interests to motivate and engage children across the curriculum. They initiate their own play activities within our outstanding environment.

Engagement Days

We hook the children into their learning with exciting engagement days such as:

- We dress up as pirates to launch our 'Pirates Ahoy!' theme
- Dorothy the Dragon leaves her eggs for us to hatch to launch our theme of 'Do Dragon Exist?'
- Clifford the big red dog goes to the grocery shop and delivers a very special red box to launch the theme of 'Where Does Food Come From'
- We have a magical ball to launch the theme 'Can I be an Author?'

Settling In

1. All About Me

The 'All About Me' tells us about things that your child likes to do (and doesn't like to do). This informs our provision during Autumn 1. This means your child will have their favourite toys to play with from the fun session and beyond. Happy, busy children will settle in quickly.

Tapestry 2.

Tapestry (more about this later), after you have activated your account, you will find a video of your child's teacher and teaching assistant/s introducing themselves to you and your child. Watching this together supports your child to become familiar with their new adults so that they settle in happily.

3. **Home Visits**

This enables your child to meet us in their familiar environment. This is a very special time for your child as they share their home life with their teachers, creating happy memories.

4. **Fun Sessions**

This is a chance for your child to play with you in our setting and to meet their new friends and teachers supporting them to be familiar with their new environment.

5. Staggered start

Whilst some children have been in a setting previously, some children haven't attended any setting previously. Regardless, starting school/Nursery is a very busy and tiring time for your child. It

can be overwhelming for them as they adjust to new routines and their new environment. Therefore, we build up the time that children spend in school/Nursery during their first week at Barrow Hedges.

As every day is a 'P.E' day in Nursery and Reception, we do ask that you adhere to our guidelines. We also ask that you note the following:

• children must not wear any jewellery



must have their hair tied up



must be wearing Velcro shoes



no nail polish



fake tattoos are not allowed



7. Pegs – Bags

The children will learn to find their pegs. There is only room for a coat and a bookbag. No rucksacks please.





8. Saying Goodbye

By the time your child starts school, they will already be feeling more confident because of our settling in procedures. They will already be more familiar with:



- their environment
- other children in the setting
- their teacher/teaching assistant by watching introduction videos on Tapestry and/or home visits

We heartily recommend that you have positive conversations about starting school and about how all the things that they love to play with will be waiting for them. Please be rest assured that their teachers and teaching assistants will make them feel happy and safe so that they can begin their learning journey in Nursery or Reception.

On your child's first day at school, reassure them that you will be coming back to get them soon and that they will have a fun time which will aid their transition. As we know this can be an anxious time for parents, no matter how you are feeling on the inside, if you are smiling and happy, your child will be too!

9. Lunch Time (Reception children only)

At our welcome evening you will get to sample the delicious and nutritious food that is offered to our children. We strongly recommend that you choose the free school meal option rather than making a packed lunch every morning. We have found that children are



much more willing to try new food at school than they are at home. Teachers and teaching assistants support the children to use their knife and fork, to carry trays when needed and to select food that they would like to eat. Children are gently encouraged to try new foods but are never forced to eat anything that they do not like.

10. Collection

Safeguarding is our absolute priority. We will never let your child go home with an unknown adult. We use a home collection book, which is located by the garden gate of Nursery and Reception however, you can always call or email the school office to inform us if another adult is collecting your child.

Children will need a water bottle at school every day. We fill this up if the children drink all of their water. Please name the bottle.

You can provide dairy free alternatives if needed (please speak to your child's teacher about this).

Fruit Scheme

The children are able to select from a wide variety of fruit and vegetables from our snack bar throughout the day. You do not need to provide a snack.

Weather – sun hats / gloves / scarfs / sun cream

Please dress your child appropriately for the weather.

In winter, your child will need a coat, gloves and hat.



Going to the Toilet



Children need to be toilet trained ready to start Nursery/School. Staff will help your child, if needed, by verbally giving them instructions on what they need to do. If further help is needed, staff will follow the guidance within our Intimate Care policy.



In summer, please send your child in with a sunhat. Please apply sun cream to your child before school (school staff are not permitted to apply it).













Occasionally a child may have a toileting accident and therefore we would appreciate it if you could provide a set of spare underwear and socks in their bags and a spare carrier bag in your child's book bag.

Appointments

If your child has an appointment during the school day, please let the office know by emailing or phoning at least 24 hours in advance. Please report to the school main office (via Harbury Road entrance) to collect and sign out your child.

Absence due to illness

If your child is unwell and unable to come to school/Nursery, please contact the school office by email on <u>office@barrowhedges.com</u> or call our absence line on 020 8643 4428 between 8.30am and 9am. This is important firstly, so we know your child is safe and secondly, to ensure your child's absence is recorded correctly.

If your child has either sickness or diarrhoea they must have a clear 2 full days following the day they were unwell.

Medication

We are only permitted to keep certain medications on the school premises (such as asthma inhalers/Epipens or other prescribed medication). These must be fully labelled with your child's name and in a clear plastic wallet. Usually, most medication is kept in the classroom to be used when required. It is a parent's responsibility to ensure that this medicine is within the date of expiry (Epipens and Asthma inhalers) and the medication does not run out. Please note: a Care Plan may be required to enable us to administer these. The School Nurse can assist with the Care Plan.

If your child is on antibiotics, we would recommend that you ask your doctor for one that can be taken three times per day so that it can be administered before school, after school and at bedtime. If your child does require medication during the school day, either yourself or a nominated adult may come into school and administer it. However, if you are unable to administer this yourself and require the school to, please speak with the school office as paperwork must be completed before we can do so. Any medication must be handed to a member of staff by an adult and must not be in your child's bookbag.

Any other forms of medication (such as Calpol, Pirition etc.) cannot be administered to your child by the school.

We are a Team!

Parents as Partners

Research shows that involving parents and carers in their child's learning is the most important factor in enabling children to do well regardless of background. Working collaboratively together maximises on children's outcomes and attainment.

Communication

We offer a range of opportunities for you to become involved in your child's learning which is important.

Your class teacher is your first port of call when you want to find out about how your child is progressing with their learning, friendships and general wellbeing.

To speak with your child's teacher, please either:

- Speak with them at the end of the school day (please wait until we have dismissed the children).
- email into the school office (office@barrowhedges.com) to request an appointment and/or stating any queries/concerns that you may have. This will then be passed on to their teacher.
 Please ensure you state your child's name and class within the email. We try to ensure all emails are responded to within 48 hours.

Tapestry

You will have seen, as part of your child's admission process, guidelines for Tapestry along with how we will use this platform to document your child's progress. Updates are provided on a weekly basis where you can find out more about your child's learning and what they have been up to whilst they are at school. Once you have



read an observation, we ask that you 'like' the post to signify this to us. You can also add your own observations to Tapestry which will form part of your child's Learning Journey (which you will receive electronically at the end of the school year – this is a very special memento showing the progress they have made throughout their Nursery/Reception year).

Helping at School

Once your child has happily settled in at Nursery/school, we love to welcome parents/carers volunteers where we have many jobs waiting for you, from filing, to helping children to read, to more creative projects! If you are able to offer your time, please speak with your child's class teacher.

Information Evenings

There will be an opportunity in the Autumn and Spring Terms to meet with your child's class teacher to discuss your child's progress. In the meantime, if you have any questions or concerns, come and see us!

Making Payments

We are a cashless school and dinner money, activities, trips and donations are paid for via ParentPay. This is a secure online payment service and is a convenient and secure way of paying.



Once your child has started at Barrow Hedges you will receive an activation email to enable you to log in to ParentPay. This letter will contain a personal activation username and password. During the activation process you will be guided through changing your username and password to something more memorable.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I bring in sweets/cakes for my child's birthday?

As we are a healthy school, we ask that you please do not send in sweets/cakes for your child's birthday. Instead, we ask that if you wish to celebrate your child's birthday by sending something into school, you either bring in fruit for our snack table, or a book for the class.

What if my child is a really fussy eater?

Staff are very patient with children who find it difficult to try new foods and make choices. They are gently encouraged, given extra time and reassured. Staff plan on an individual basis to support children so that they have eaten, are not hungry and can concentrate on their learning in the afternoon.

I'm worried about my child making friends, what can I do?

Naturally, children play alongside other children as part of their social development, and we will support them to develop highly positive relationships. Talk to your child's class teacher if you have any concerns and they will be able to give advice and support, including sharing their observations of your child's social interactions with their peers.

What do I do if my child has lost something?

There is a lost property box in Nursery/Reception for any unnamed items. You are welcome to look in this after school. However, if you name everything, your child's belongings will not get lost!

Can you wipe my child's bottom for them?

While we won't wipe their bottom for them, we would of course support them and talk them through, ensuring that they aren't in any discomfort. We ask that this is something you practise with your child in the summer holidays (and on an ongoing basis if needed). We want the children to be as independent as possible.

Independence = confident, resilient and courageous children.

Independent skills like being able to use the toilet, being able to undo their own zips, putting on their shoes and carrying their bookbags in turn helps the children to be confident, resilient and courageous in their learning.

When will my child need a PE kit? (Reception children only)

We will let you know when your child will need a PE kit. You do not need to buy one for September.

Will you celebrate religious/cultural festivals?

Yes, we do. The children learn that we are all unique with different likes, dislikes, hair colour, skin colour, beliefs and cultural backgrounds, for example. We recognise and celebrate diversity, which is personalised to the children in the year group so that everyone is 'seen' and recognises themselves within our curriculum.

How can my child get help?

Teachers/teaching assistants sensitively build positive relationships with each and every child. They will get to know your child's facial expressions, jiggles for the toilet, their general demeanour etc. and will respond to their needs so that every child feels happy and safe at school. We have found it to be really beneficial for parents to encourage their child to approach familiar adults while at school and say, "help me, please" if/when they feel this is needed. This will help children to use their words which in turn builds their independence.
