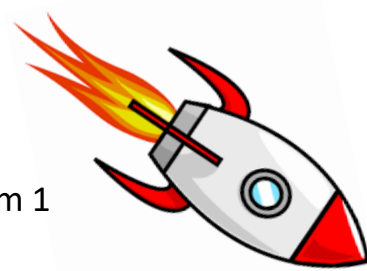

History: Great Explorers



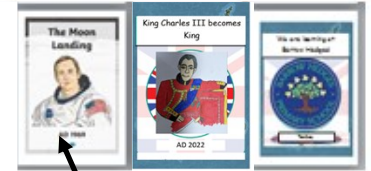
Key Vocabulary	
<b>astronaut</b>	A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft.
<b>explorer</b>	An explorer is someone who goes on an <b>exploration</b> .
<b>exploration</b>	A journey where <b>explorers</b> travel to unfamiliar places.
<b>NASA</b>	(In the USA) National Aeronautics and Space
<b>recent</b>	In the past but not long ago.
<b>significant</b>	Important and worth knowing.

Key Facts	
<b>Who was Neil Armstrong?</b> 	Neil Armstrong was the first man on the moon, who famously said, "One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." He was joined on the moon after 19 minutes by Buzz Aldrin.
<b>Who was Katherine Johnson?</b> 	Katherine Johnson was part of a team of mathematicians whose calculations made it possible for people to travel to the moon and back safely. She was one of the first African-American women to work as a NASA scientist.
<b>Who is Mae Jemison?</b> 	Mae Jemison was the first African American woman to become an astronaut.
<b>Who is Tim Peake?</b> 	Tim Peake was the first British Astronaut to visit the ISS
