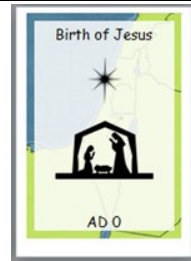
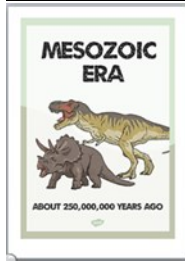
What has changed in the last 100 years?

Key Vocabulary	
Artefact	Something made by people that we can use to tell us about the past.
Decade	10 years
Local	Something relating to the area near to where I live.
National	Something relating to the country where I live.
Significant	Something which is considered important. It might have caused a big change, or be especially worth remembering.

Key Facts	
How have things changed since the 1950s? <i>There are lots of possible answers here. Examples might include:</i>	We now have colour television. We have mobile telephones. We have interactive whiteboards. Our clothes and toys are often made of different things.
Why was Croydon Airport so important to our local area.	London Croydon Airport was Britain's first international airport. This made our area a place that lots of people wanted to live. It meant that there were lots of people from all around the world, coming to live in our local area. When the air port was closed, lots of houses were built on the land, but you can still see some of the old buildings.
