Digital Literacy and Information Technology

Prior Knowledge

E-safety: Review

To know that some online identities may be misleading or false.

To show awareness of the different forms of online communication and find out about their associated risks.

Computing Key Vocabulary		
Attachment	A file sent with an email message. It may be an image, video, text document, or any other type of file.	
Email	Electronic mail - allows you to send and receive messages to and from anyone with an email address, anywhere in the world.	
E-safety	The safe and responsible use of technology.	
Hyperlink	An electronic link that allows a computer user to move directly from one place (such as a website or document) to another in the same or a different document.	
Mail Server	A computer system that sends and receives emails	
Spam	Unwanted, unsolicited advertising, typically by email	
Spoofed link	Hyperlinks that look as though they point to one website but actually point to another.	
Video conference	Allows users in different locations to hold face-to- face meetings without having to move to a single location together.	
Virus	A program that is able to copy itself when it is run and spread to other devices.	


