



Children will already know about publishing work online having created mixed-media vlogs in Year Three.




E-safety:

Computing Key Vocabulary	
Back Key	A button that will take you back to either the homepage or an earlier subpage.
Home page	The first webpage a visitor to a website will see.
Hyperlink	Text or images that, when clicked, opens another page or moves to another part of the document.
URL	The address of a page or resource on the web.
Webpage	A single digital document.
Website	A collection of webpages under one URL
Wiki	A website that allows the creation and editing of any number of interlinked web pages via a web browser; often used to create collaborative works.
Wikipedia's Five Pillars	The five fundamental principles of Wikipedia that users must follow.






