What is a continent?

### Key Facts

How many **continents** are there?



There are 7 continents. These are: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe and Australasia (which is sometimes called Australia or Oceania).

How many **oceans** are there?



There are 5 oceans. These are: The Arctic Ocean, the Atlantic Ocean, the Indian Ocean, the Pacific Ocean and the Southern Ocean.

Where do we live in the world?

We live in England, which is part of the United Kingdom. This is a part of the continent of Europe.

What is a natural feature?



A natural feature (sometimes called a **physical feature**) could include rocks, caves, cliffs, forests or mountains. These happen without any help from people.

What features are made by people?



A feature made by people (sometimes called a **human feature**) could include bridges, buildings and roads. These do not happen appear without any help from people.

If a map or satellite image shows me a blue area, what does that mean?

A blue area on a map shows me water such as a lake, ocean or river.

If a map or satellite image shows me a green area, what does that mean?

A green area on a map shows me land such as a park, garden or forest.

<b>sea</b>	Salt water that makes up a lot of our planet.
