This means that it is now becoming increasingly difficult to run all of the annual events we have become used to offering. You will note that we are only able to offer Y2 and Y6 discos and the Reception Party this year and this has, in part, been due to lack of parental support (but also for those scheduled in the Spring term we did not have access to the hall). It would be lovely if parents would be able to lend a helping hand. We all appreciate that everyone's lives are so busy, and recognise that many of you do not have time to commit to being a

As part of the day we had a show, "It Takes Guts!" - all about the digestive system. We had a great day!


### **THANK YOU FROM YEAR 6**
